The Healing Place for **Men** now has a sister. The Healing Place for Women will offer the same effective, longterm, peer-to-peer recovery program to females. Women in the program will experience minor differences from their brothers located at 700 Dinwiddie Avenue. A Family Visitation Suite, for example, will allow mothers to reunite with their children and nurture those relationships during their recovery journey.

In 2019, The CARITAS Furniture Bank lost its first warehouse on Commerce Road to redevelopment. We temporarily moved into a smaller location at Gordon Avenue as we waited for the CARITAS Center to open. During the pandemic, we adapted our donation and shopping procedures to keep everyone safe. We are proud to say our new CARITAS Center warehouse is full of donations and accepting shoppers.
